

**NOTICE OF 30-DAY PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD AND PUBLIC HEARING ON  
JOHNSON COUNTY'S  
PROPOSED 2010-2014 CONSOLIDATED PLAN and  
2010 ACTION PLAN  
FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) and  
HOME INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIPS (HOME) PROGRAMS**

On September 17, 2009 the Johnson County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) will set September 18, 2009 through October 21, 2009 as the public comment period and October 22, 2009 as the Public Hearing date on Johnson County's proposed 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan and proposed Action Plan for 2010. The Public Hearing will be held during the 9:30 a.m. BOCC meeting in the Hearing Room on the third floor of the County Administration Building, 111 South Cherry Street, Olathe, Kansas. The purpose of the 30-day public comment period and the Public Hearing is to receive comments from citizens on the proposed 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan and proposed uses of the 2010 CDBG and HOME program funding. All comments will be included in the final 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan prior to submitting the Plan to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.
